

### Safety Note - Congestion of the Aisle in the Exp Hall

- Recently there seems to be more material (cabinets, boxes, etc.) that is being stored in the main aisle of the Experiment Hall.
- Clear "rules" about the allocation and use of the space around the aisle has never been clearly spelled out.





 The situation will no doubt get worse as space demands increase during the Upgrade and so we want to start to work on this problem now.

### Space Utilization of the Experiment Hall Main Aisle

- We need to have a more detailed plan for the "common area" main aisle ring spaces, as well as availability of long-term and temporary space in nearby buildings.
- Already seeing increasing issues with congestion of the aisle
  - Need your short-term help in reducing clutter, evaluating space usage in your area
- APS is forming a working group to draft "Improved Space Allocation Policies and Procedures". We have asked for PUC participation in this development of the P&P. If you have any suggestions/comments, please send them to Bill Ruzicka.

  - Plan to get the most up-to-date advice on potential budget scenarios


